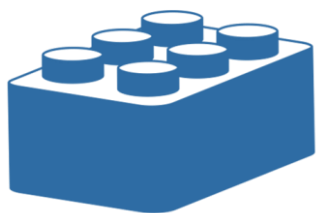
Practical Mathematics

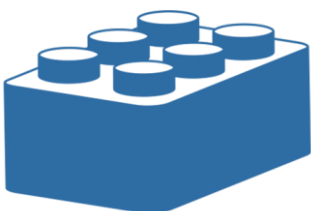

APPLE REGIONAL TRAINING

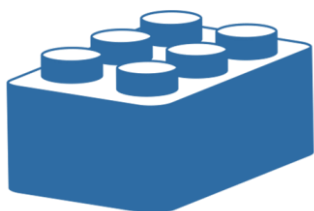


Apple Regional Training Centres deliver courses to build the skills and confidence of educators to use Apple technology inside and outside the classroom.

13th, 14th and 15th September 2023

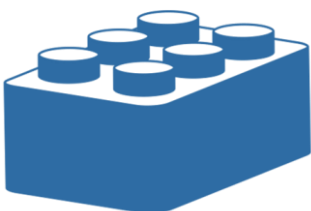

Course content includes Introducing Working Safely, Defining Hazard and Risk, Identifying Common Hazards, Improving Safety Performance and Protecting our Environment

Throughout the course, you'll learn how to identify different types of hazards and decide how to control them. You'll use a risk assessment to communicate the likelihood of accidents, list the potential consequences, and apply controls.

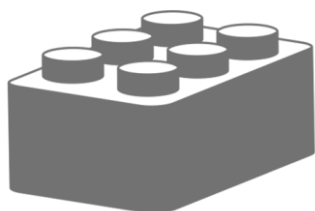
Every member of staff has their own exclusive login to the St. Bart's Trust Central Hub which provides them with access to our online community.

Led by BTSA, working in partnership with the University of Derby, the school based experience is at the heart of the programme.


