

PRIMARY SUBJECT LEADER SESSIONS


Join us for a series of halftermly sessions covering six inspection focus areas –

- To plan, implement and review key aspects of the recommendations within your own school, building on a strategic, whole school approach to SEND.

Outline of the sessions:

Each CPD session will cover the key recommendations from the guidance, opportunities to discuss practical implementation and time to reflect on current practice / next steps. There will be an emphasis on developing SEND leadership and practice through a strategic, whole school approach to SEND.

Following each session, SENDCOs will be invited to complete a gap task which will support them in improving the quality of SEND provision at school.

FIRST AID AWARDS (FAA) FOR MENTAL HEALTH



Level 2 Award in First Aid for Mental Health Tuesday 21st May 2024

This course is designed to provide individuals with the knowledge to recognise a range of mental health conditions, how to start a supportive conversation and when and how to signpost a person to seek professional help.

Course Content:

- Understand and define what mental health is
- Understand the stigma surrounding mental health
- Why young people develop mental health conditions
- The role of a First Aider for Mental Health
- Provide advice and practical support for a person presenting a mental health condition
- How to diagnose and manage stress
- How to recognise a range of mental health conditions
- Understand the impact of substance abuse on mental health
- Understand and develop a first aid action plan
- Implementation of a positive mental health culture in the workplace

Suitable For: Managers who as part of their working duties associate with people who are susceptible to mental health issues/complications and are able to make positive influences and changes to the business.

Level 2 Award in First Aid for Youth Mental Health Tuesday 4th June 2024

This course is designed to provide individuals with the knowledge and skills to identify a range of mental health conditions, how to start a supportive conversation with children and when and how to guide them to professional help.

Course Content:

- Understand and define what mental health is
- Understand the stigma surrounding mental health
- Why young people develop mental health conditions
- The role of a First Aider for Mental Health
- How to diagnose and manage stress
- How to recognise a range of mental health conditions
- Understand and develop a first aid action plan
- Understanding of legal consent and safeguarding responsibilities

Suitable For:

All employees who as part of their working duties associate with children susceptible to mental health issues/complications. Also, those requiring further knowledge and understanding for the recognition of mental health issues which could include eating disorders, bullying and self-harm.






Every member of staff has their own exclusive login to the St. Bart's Trust Central Hub which provides them with access to our online community.
